Preparation.

6" x 1.5" blanks

Note. This demo focuses on form, profile, and rim choices for decorative platters.

Objectives.

Explore decorative platter profiles, proportions, and integration of design elements. Create a decorative platter.

Add and modify design and decorative features for comparison.

Introduction.

Scope: Decorative platter with relatively large rim and small mouth.

Myriad variey of design elements.

Process.

Blank Selection.

Hazards

Cracks bad, wind checks <u>dangerous!</u> Embedded foreign objects (IFOs).

Flat sawn, quarter sawn, rift sawn

Orientation (pith side / bark side up, figure, symmetry)

Wood moves!

Mounting Options.

Between centers.

Between chuck jaws and live center.

Woodworm.

Forstner recess.

Turning the Bottom.

Proportions.

Height to diameter.

Base to diameter.

Profile.

Safety Alert.

Wear a face shield. Respect the kill zone.

Beware of IFOs

Tip.

Mounting with a forstner hole reduces opportunity to balance figure.

Tip.

3 S's - Secure, Spins (freely), Speed (down)

Tip.

"Roll in" to engage cutting edge from bevel when the tail stock is in the way.

Mouth size.

Base / foot to side.

Side to rim.

Tenon or recess to remount.

Tip.

ABC's of tool presntation: Anchor, Bevel, Cut.

Turning the Top.

Face off top.

Rim thickness?

Relief carve? Pierce? Thin?

Outside to inside point of no return.

Mouth.

Ogee.

Crisp corner.

Undercut.

Rim.

Transitions / framing.

Embellish.

How much and where?

Framing.

On lathe.

Spiraling tool. (color for visibility)

Beads, coves, grooves.

Beading tool. (rings)

Threading die.

Indexing.

Off lathe.

Carving (hand, reciprocal, rotary)

Burning, woodburning, branding.

Piercing.

Inlay.

Tip.

Fancy design and fantastic figure very often don't play well together.

Note.

Index with 9 segments for 4 phase celtic knot moebius interweave pattern.
